Recycling Explained

In order to answer a few lingering questions about our recycling programs we have decided to take one more month to discuss recycling. Last year (2011) the City implemented a [green waste recycling program](#) with a 90 gallon, [green container](#); this program is for grass clippings, garden waste, tree and shrub trimmings, etc. We are currently in the process of implementing a [general curbside recycling program](#) with a 90 gallon [blue container](#). This program is for paper, plastics, cardboard, and some metals. Because this new program is completely separate and different from green waste recycling, we have been requiring an opt-out form be completed and submitted to City Hall if you do not want to participate. Below are some reminders for Green Waste Recycling and some commonly asked questions and questions we anticipate receiving about the NEW General Curbside Recycling program.

Green Waste Recycling

For the months December through March, your green container can be used for general trash. However, beginning April 1st through November 30th this container should **ONLY** be used for green waste. For more information or reminders on acceptable and unacceptable green waste items please visit our website. Click on the "Services" tab at the top, then Utility Billing and Green Waste Recycling.

General Curbside Recycling

If you haven't received your blue recycling can, it should be arriving within the next week or two. The can is a [90 gallon can](#) and should look exactly like your black trashcan (except it will be blue of course).

What if I opted out and still received the blue can?

We hope this doesn't happen and we sincerely apologize if it does. We are keeping records of those who opt out and our hauler, EconoWaste is delivering the cans. With two groups working together there might be an occasional mistake and we will correct it as soon as we can. So if this does happen, please contact us, 801-776-0970. Also, if you submitted your opt-out form after we gave the list to the guys delivering the cans, you may have a can delivered, but don't worry we will get it straightened out. Thanks for your patience and help!

When will I see charges on my utility bill?

Charges will not take effect until after all cans have been delivered. So the Utility bill you receive the beginning of June will show the first charge.

When will EconoWaste pick up my recycled materials?

General Recycling (blue can) will be collected every other week on the same day as regular trash day. Attached to your blue can, when it is delivered, will be a calendar that shows which weeks will be the general recycling week. [Green Waste](#) will continue to be collected every week.

Where can I find a list of what I can and cannot recycle?

Attached to your blue can, when it is delivered, will be a list of acceptable and unacceptable materials. Please keep this nearby so you can refer to it. We realize it will take some time to get used to this list, but ask that you follow it as strictly as possible. If you lose the list you can find the information on our website.

Do I need to separate my recyclables and can I bag them?

No, you do not need to separate the materials. Bagged materials may be viewed as garbage and may not be picked up unless it is obvious to the driver that it is shredded paper or newspapers. As a result, you may want to avoid putting out your can on days when there are high winds.

What if I decide I don't want to participate after a few months?

We really hope this doesn't happen! Due to the nature of the program and to keep our costs low, participation will be mandatory for those who did not opt out. However, if you have opted out and decide you want to recycle you can enroll in the program at any time.


