**Rate increases to be aware of:**

The North Davis Sewer District increased it's rate by \$1.00/per connection. You will notice a rate increase from \$13.70 to \$14.70.

The water rate increase for **West Point Water** was based on a resolution passed in 2010 outlining rate increases over a 3-year period. The base rate increased from \$21.25 to \$22.50 for the first 6,000 gallons used. **(This rate increase will not affect the West Point residents who are on Hooper Water)**

**SR-193 EXTENSION UPDATE**

Here's a brief update on the SR-193 Extension Project.

- \*Utility relocations are nearly complete
- \*Railroad work is scheduled to begin later this month
- \*The bulk of construction will take place next year but you may see some heavy construction starting this fall
- \*Project completion is scheduled for 2014

UDOT will be asking for interested contractors to submit proposals for the SR-193 Extension Project at the end of July. The contractor will be selected based on qualifications and not strictly based on price. We are hoping to have a contractor selected in September. Once we have a contractor on board, we will have a better idea about schedule and road closures.
