MAYORS MESSAGE

As long as I have been involved in local government I don't remember any year that we had more going on in West Point than this past year. Whether it has been road construction, park or trail improvements and the new Smith's it has really kept our staff busy and man will it be nice to get the roads put back together. Here is a run-down and update on some of these projects.

3000 West Widening

I am pretty confident that everyone is glad to see this project finish up this fall. Closing a road in the middle of the city has been challenging and I appreciate everyone's patience especially those who live on 3000 W. The round about at 550 should open up soon and then once that is open the

800 North and 3000 West intersection will be closed. Once the roundabouts are finished the only part of the project that will have to be completed next spring will be from about 1050 North to 1300 North. As I mentioned before, the reason we did not complete the entire project is the contractor had to wait for some utility relocation.

200 South Trail

For those of you who have used this trail you noticed not all of it was paved from about 2700 West to 2000 West. As I have mentioned in past newsletters we ran out of money and could not finish the project with the grant we received. Our staff contacted Davis County and with the help of Commission-

er Petroff we were able to team up with them to get the pavement done and complete the trail. This is a good example of how important it is to have a past Mayor in John Petroff serving on the County Commission. Thanks JP.

2000 West Widening

Although this project has not started I thought I would give you a quick update. Utility relocation will start next year from 300 North to Antelope Drive in Syracuse. The actual widening and major work will be started in 2017. Unfortunately there are some lifelong residents who will have to be relocated to make way for the widening. UDOT will have to purchase all the homes on the west side of 2000 West from 300 North to Highway 193 and this process has already started. Growth is a tough thing especially for these resi-

dents but everyone who travels 2000 West will agree that something needs to be done. I have been asked if this project is because Smith's is coming? This widening project has been planned for more than a decade and it is just a coincidence that the Smith's is being built right before the construction takes place on 2000 West.

I hope everyone has a great Thanksgiving. Be thankful for what we have, for where we live and for the blessings we enjoy. I am grateful for the opportunity I have to serve you, it has been a pleasure to serve and represent all of you. If you have any questions comments or concerns please call me.

"SNOW INEVITABLE" WINTER PARKING

With winter just around the corner, the Public Works employees are preparing to ensure that our roads are clear of snow. Their efforts mean that early morning commutes on snowy days are a bit easier for all of us. However, we need your help to make sure snow removal can be accomplished in the safest and most efficient manner possible. West Point City Code 10.05.50H3 prohibits the parking of any vehicle, trailer, recreational vehicle, etc, on streets between the hours of 1 a.m. and 6 a.m. from November 1st until the last day of February. Our Code Enforcement Officer and the Davis County Sheriff's Department will be patrolling streets during the winter months and will issue notices and citations. Vehicles could even be towed at the owner's expense. Also please be aware that pushing or blowing snow onto public streets is also strictly prohibited by law. As you clear snow, please ensure that your snow stays on your property. Your cooperation in helping the city deal with another winter is greatly appreciated. West Point Veterans Memorial

Wednesday, November 11th, is Veterans Day. This date was first recognized on November 11, 1919, commemorating the signing of the Armistice which marked the cessation of the hostilities of what we now call World War I. The signing and the effective date took place on the “eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month” of 1918. Observance of the Armistice date was to recognize those who served in the “great war.”

Following WWII, President Truman signed into law a congressional bill changing the name to Veterans Day and making it a national holiday, now commemorating the service of all those who served, living or dead.

The West Point Military Memorial Committee has proposed that, following the completion of the Military Memorial, the committee hold an annual commemorative program at the site for the public. This will have special significance in just three years when we will celebrate the centennial of the signing of the Armistice. We should all remember our veterans on this date each year. Fly the Flag!
