Commercial Development

Highway I93 Update

I would like to thank Senator Jerry Stevenson and Representatives Paul Ray and Mike Schultz for all they did to secure the funding for this much needed project. It was a joint effort with our legislators and our neighbors to the north and south of us to get this project moving. GETTING READY FOR WINTER

Early fall is a busy time for all of us. Gardens need to be put away for winter, sprinklers need to be repaired and drained, fall fertilizer needs to be applied, lawn toys put away, etc. One of the most important tasks that needs to be done in anticipation of the winter month is tree trimming.

It is very difficult for the City Public Works employees to safely and efficiently plow City Streets unless trees are trimmed properly. The West Point City Code requires that trees must be trimmed to a minimum height of 13ft 6in above the curb. This allows our snow removal equipment and garbage truck sufficient overhead room to safely complete their tasks. Please look at your trees and trim them to help these workers perform their vital duties.

Your cooperation in helping the City deal with another great winter is greatly appreciated.

Vote By-Mail The Path Of Your Ballot




1. When a jurisdiction decides to conduct its elections by mail this is what a voter should expect.

2. Ballot packets will be mailed to registered voters beginning 28 days before each election. The ballot packet includes:

- Outer envelope
- Inner return envelope
- Ballot

3. The US Postal Service delivers the ballot packet to each registered voter.

4. The voter makes their selections on the ballot and places the voted ballot in the envelope. The voter signs and seals the envelope and prepares their ballot to be returned.



5. The voter returns their ballot using one of three methods.

1. Through the mail
2. At one of the drop locations
3. At a polling location on Election Day

6. Upon return, the ballot is placed in a batch for processing with other returned ballots. The County Clerk will:

- Scan the barcode on the envelope label, creating a return log and a vote history for the voter, which ensures that only one ballot is returned for each voter.

7. The privacy tab of the envelope is opened revealing the signed affidavit, but maintaining the ballot sealed in the envelope.

Every signature is compared to the signature that is associated with each voter's registration. After the signature is verified, the affidavit is removed from the envelope, making the envelope anonymous.

8. The envelope is opened, the ballot removed.

9. The ballot is unfolded and prepared for counting.

10. After the ballots are counted results will be released Election Night.
