MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Celebrating 150 years of Elementary Education in West Point

On September 7th 1869, records show that the first school, in what is now West Point City, opened and started classes. The actual dates of construction vary in history, but at some point before classes began, a one-room schoolhouse was built out of sun-dried adobe bricks. This 36-ft. by 26 ft. school cost just over \$2,000 to build and was located at roughly 2040 North and 5000 W in what used to be known as South Hooper. This school was made possible by the community not only contributing to the cost of the school, but by also pitching in to actually help construct the building.

The second school was also a one-room schoolhouse built on the corner of 4500 West and 300 North and was an even smaller at 23 ft by 30 ft. (Just to give you some perspective, each of the 13 portables that are now behind West Point Junior High are about 34 ft. by 24 ft). This second school was only in this location for a few years before it was moved to the corner of 1300 North and 4500 West, where it was expanded into a two-room schoolhouse we consider as West Point's third school.

After about 16 years, the fourth school in West Point was built. This fourth, brick school was completed in 1911 and is located right where West Point Elementary sits today. Before it was torn down in 1996, it had four original rooms and a well that piped water into the school, with some of the water actually used in heating the classrooms. My 1st and 2nd grade years attending West Point Elementary were in that old schoolhouse and I remember the old radiator-type heaters under the big, old wooden windows. I may have spent some recess time washing those big windows after getting into a little trouble, but that is another story for another newsletter.

Getting back to relevant information, the West Point Elementary PTA is holding a celebration to commemorate this 150th Anniversary of the first school in West Point. The celebration will be held Saturday, September 7th, beginning with a Fun Run/Walk at 7:30 AM, followed by a breakfast at 8:00 and short program at 9:00. An interesting side note – 150 years later, West Point City now has two elementary schools and one junior high. In the near future, a second junior high will begin construction, and the Davis School District also has property for two more elementary schools, a third junior high, and a new high school.

With fall coming upon us and summer ending, please remember that our kids are back in school and to please be careful as you travel through school zones and be mindful of those walking to and from school each day. Reduced speeds and alert drivers can help us make sure we keep our West Point students safe.

I want to remind residents of West Point City to look at your trees, especially those growing in park strips, and cut them back so that vehicles can pass and pedestrians can walk on the sidewalks. This is especially important for those of you who live on the streets that children use to walk back and forth to school. If a tree creates a line of sight issue, it is very dangerous for young children who might not be paying attention.

Weeds can also become a problem for our school kids. Goat heads puncture bike tires and stick to the soles of shoes as they walk on sidewalks. Please look at your property and keep weeds cut back from sidewalks so that our kids do not have to avoid these sidewalks by walking in the streets.
